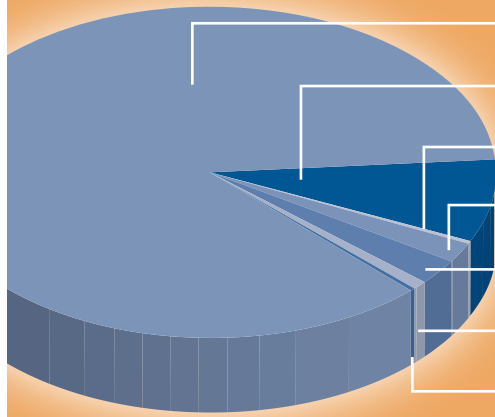

## More Than Just a House

Salma\* and her partner arrived at Associated Ministries **in need of safe and secure housing**. Salma and her partner, a disabled veteran, had exhausted all of their options, leaving them homeless with nowhere else to go.

**AM sprang into action. Salma and her partner met with our team and were able to get a HUD-VASH voucher (a federal housing voucher for veterans), securing their housing long-term.** AM and our partners do this work every day, helping thousands of Pierce County individuals and families get off the streets and into their own homes.

The gift of housing is truly transformative. Salma shared with AM, *"Since being housed, I have been able to focus more on daily responsibilities such as looking for work and returning to school. I have been able to focus more on my health. I am now able to show my children I am moving forward in my life in a positive manner. I am able to make and keep appointments. Having a place to live allows me to eat warm and healthy meals daily. This has also allowed me to make more connections in the community."*

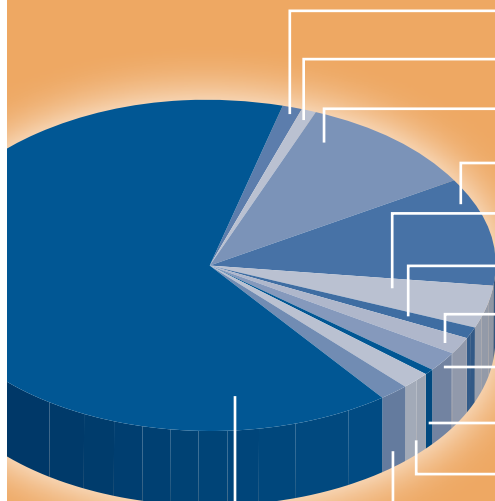
