Rebuilding a life worth living: Destiny’s Journey

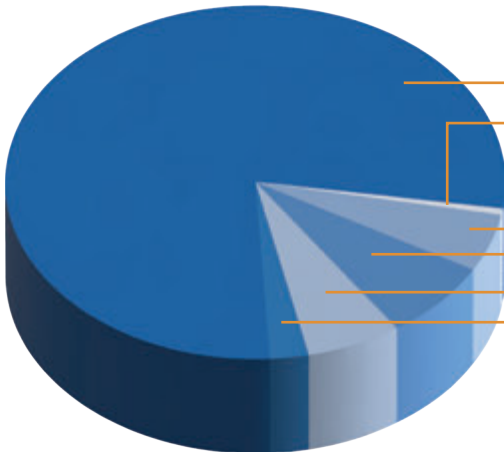

She shares that “home” now means being surrounded by the loved ones she once lost and has finally reconnected with.

Derrick spent years navigating instability — from foster care to group homes to long stretches of couch surfing. Despite the chaos, he graduated high school and kept fighting for a stable future. After a violent incident left him with nowhere to turn, he connected with AM and finally found safety, support, and a place to call home. Through the Youth Host Home Program, Derrick received consistent guidance and a stable living environment, allowing him to start adulthood with confidence. Now housed, employed, and supported by a counselor he trusts, he says he’s stepping into the future with hope — grateful for the foundation AM helped him build.
